

## **ART HISTORY**

Grade Level: 10, 11, 12

Credit: 1.0

Prerequisites: None

This course offers a broad view of the development of western art from early Greece to the present. Lessons link the development of art forms to their political, cultural, and religious settings. Students visit the world's heritage sites, museums, and galleries on- line to view examples of painting, architecture, and sculpture. Students learn characteristics of major art periods, acquire a basic art vocabulary, and develop skills in analyzing and observing art.
